

## College of Pharmacy Sanctions for Current Students with a Positive Drug Screen

Except in compelling circumstances, any student with a positive drug screen will be suspended for the remainder of the semester and be administratively withdrawn from all courses and will also be suspended for the subsequent semester. The Board of Pharmacy will be notified that the student is not enrolled in College of Pharmacy courses.

As a condition of re-enrolling in College of Pharmacy courses, the student must be evaluated, no later than one (1) month after the positive drug screen, by a health care professional affiliated with a treatment program approved by the College and must follow the health care professional's recommendations. The student must release the results of the evaluation and resulting recommendations to the College. The expense of evaluations and associated recommendations are the responsibility of the student.

Additional conditions of re-enrollment imposed by the College may include but are not limited to:

- Drug Abuse Counseling
- Conflict Resolution Training
- Anger Management Training

If the College has received the health care professional's evaluation and results, the recommendations of the health care professional have been met, and the student is approved for re-enrollment in courses, random drug screenings will be required through an OUHSC designated vendor for the remainder of the student's enrollment. Failure to cooperate in or pass a random drug screening will result in immediate dismissal from the College.
