

## **PGY2 RESIDENCY**

## **AMBULATORY CARE (ASHP Accredited)**

### **POSITION**

The goal of this ASHP accredited PGY2 residency in ambulatory care is to prepare the post-doctoral resident for a career in ambulatory care pharmacy practice with either a health care or an academic institution. This one year position provides the resident with the academic rank of Clinical Instructor with the University of Oklahoma College of Pharmacy. Potential practice sites include the University of Oklahoma Family Medicine Center, the internal medicine clinics at the OU Physicians Building, and other clinic sites on the campus of the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center. Learning experiences are planned to meet the individual developmental needs of each resident. Practice sites offer the opportunity to provide ambulatory care pharmacotherapy services for reimbursement through collaborative practice agreements in a group practice of faculty physicians and post-graduate residents and fellows. Residents are required to complete an original research project or participate in an ongoing research project. Additionally, the resident is involved in the education of Pharm.D. students, medical students, PGY1 residents, and resident physicians.

### **FACILITIES**

The residency will be offered and administered by the University of Oklahoma College of Pharmacy. The resident will function as a clinical pharmacist in the University of Oklahoma Family Medicine Center and the internal medicine clinics at the OU Physicians Building. The Family Medicine Center provides primary care to men, women, and children and logs approximately 55,000 outpatient visits each year.

### **PRECEPTORS**

The program director is Mark Britton, Pharm.D., CDE, BC-ADM. Faculty members with program responsibilities are Becky Armor, Pharm.D., CDE; Jennifer Chonlahan, Pharm.D., BCPS; Vincent Dennis, Pharm.D., BCPS, CDE; Todd Marcy, Pharm.D., BCPS, CDE; Toni Ripley, Pharm.D., BCPS; and Nancy Letassy, Pharm.D., CDE. The resident will also have opportunities to interact with ambulatory care and other pharmacy residents, pharmacy fellows, pharmacists, allied health care practitioners, and medical practitioners specializing in a variety of disciplines at the various practice sites.

## **STIPEND AND BENEFITS**

The stipend is \$39,500 for the residency year. Residents have ten vacation days and there are twelve days of holiday time during the residency year. A flexible benefits package is offered by The University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center. Time is made available for both interviewing and attending at least one residency conference.

## **QUALIFICATIONS**

Candidates must have a Pharm.D. degree from an ACPE-accredited college or school of pharmacy, completed a PGY1 residency, and demonstrate the personal and professional maturity required of the specialty pharmacy practitioner. Candidates must be eligible for licensure in the state of Oklahoma.

## **APPLICATION**

Interested individuals are encouraged to submit an application, letter of intent, curriculum vitae, three letters of recommendation, and transcripts for all pharmacy education. Selected applicants will be invited for interviews in Oklahoma City. Interested candidates are required to register with the ASHP Residency Matching Program.
