

PGY1 Pharmacy Residency (ASHP Accredited) Program Structure (Updated September 2025)

Core Rotations: 9 required rotations

- 1. Orientation to OU College of Pharmacy and OU Health (1 month) July
- 2. Inpatient Internal Medicine (1 month) "Fall Semester"
- 3. Clinical Staffing Orientation December
- 4. Practice Management (1 month)—Offered in February-April
- 5. Research (1 month) "Spring Semester"
- 6. General Pediatrics (1 month) "Fall Semester"
- 7. Inpatient Infectious Diseases (1 month) typically "Spring Semester", but can be "Fall Semester" if needed
- 8. Critical Care (1 month): "Spring Semester"
 - a. Medical Intensive Care Unit
 - b. Trauma Intensive Care Unit
 - c. Pediatric Intensive Care Unit
 - d. Pediatric Cardiac Intensive Care Unit
- 9. Ambulatory care (1 month): "Fall Semester"
 - a. General Internal Medicine Clinic at OU Physicians Building
 - b. Head and Neck Oncology Clinic at Stephenson Cancer Center
 - c. Outpatient Family Medicine at OU Health
 - d. Pediatric Hematology/Oncology Clinic at OU Children's Physicians Building
 - e. Cystic Fibrosis Clinic at OU Children's Physicians Building
